

# Bensalem's Mile Marker Mystery!

Bensalem's mile markers (or stones) located on Bristol Pike have been around since colonial times (before the American Revolution). There are (4) mile markers located on Bristol Pike with their hand engraved designations of 12T, 13T, 14T and 15T on their face side. Familiar landmarks that Bensalem residents still love, and although their original use is outdated their charm is definitely not. However, recently one of our mile markers 12T (shown above) has *mysteriously disappeared!* Members of the society and the general public were outraged that someone would steal a piece of Bensalem's history. Some members were so upset they urged Kathy Leighton (our society's president) to file a theft report for mile marker 12T with the Bensalem Police Department dated January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023. Police are still investigating, but who would steal a heavy stone mile marker?

Since the return of this mile marker appears unlikely, our board of directors has begun soliciting bids to replace mile marker 12T with a duplicate and that is where you can help. Our historical society is kicking off a new fundraiser called "Go the extra mile!"
