Over the past months we have been helping a man from Croydon who is researching a German club that met on the Croydon side of the Neshaminy creek. This Deutschhorst County Club existed there back in the 1930's as an athletic club and they did fly the German Flag but under the American Flag. Does anyone have any information about this club in order to help us learn more about it?

Here is notice from back in 1935 that appeared in the Bristol Courier Times: "Cornwells Heights—Students of Bensalem Township High School are to witness a unique demonstration on Tuesday afternoon next. An autogiro, following a short air demonstration, will make a landing on the athletic field at the high school at 1:30. The pilot, William S. McCormick, Lansdowne, accompanied Admiral Richard Byrd on his second Antarctic expedition, serving as autogiro pilot for the party. He will make the trip here in the same plane he used for the jaunts at the tip of the world. Pilot McCormick will then give an illustrated lecture in the school auditorium and will tell the students of many thrilling experiences which occurred during his trip." Wouldn't it wonderful to know the stories he told?

Photos of exterior, interior, and rear of the Red Lion Inn to be copied for our files. You will keep the original photo.




If you found any photos while cleaning closets etc. that you don't know what they are, maybe it is from our above list. Don't just throw them out, let us see them or help you identify them.
