ICE SOCIAL EVENT

Our first meeting on Sept. 2nd was held in the Pavilion at 6pm. Not many members attended so some had an extra ice cream sandwich to enjoy.

PIRATE SHIP "WHYDAH GALLY"

On October 7th, Mike Jesberger revealed the fascinating history of this pirate ship. Built in 1716 in London as a slave ship but on the return leg of its' maiden voyage it was captured by the pirate Captain Samuel "Black Sam" Bellamy and began a new role in the Golden Age of Piracy. Bellamy sailed the Whydah up the coast of colonial America capturing many ships along the way. Unfortunately, on April 26, 1717 it was caught in a violent storm and wrecked off the coast of Cape Cod, Massachusetts. All but 2 of the 150 man crew perished but 102 bodies were found and buried by a local salvager.

The Whydah was carrying 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 5 tons of silver, gold, gold dust, and jewelry which had been divided into 180..50 pound sacks that were stored between the ship decks. None of this bounty was found

until 1984 when Barry Clifford found the wreckage after finding a 1717 map of the wreck site. A true Pirate treasure map! For over 260 years this treasure lay under 14 feet of water and 5 feet of sand. One of the biggest finds in 1985, was that of the ship's bell inscribed "Whydah Gally 1716" proving that it was indeed the original pirate ship and authenticated it beyond a doubt. 
Pa. Museum donated items from the Logan Collection; a large miniature collection and several straight razors.
