" Legend of Sleepy Hollow"

Mike Jesberger never fails to draw a crowd for one of his programs. On Oct. 6th he told us the fascinating tale of the Headless Horseman which most of us heard about every October when we were children. In the small Dutch town of Tarrytown, NY back about 1790 following the Revolutionary War, many of the Hessian soldiers and officers were buried in the local Church Graveyard and the Dutch residents did not like that. These Hessians were paid by the British to fight the Americans, They came from an area in Germany called Hessia and were related to King George III. They were taller and larger than most

Americans and were known to be fierce fighters, therefore feared by all. A Hessian General was buried in the church cemetery after his Head had been blown off by a cannon ball. He was thought to be the headless horseman in the legend. American author Washington Irving published the story about the legend of Sleepy Hollow in 1820.

In the story a young man named Ichabod Crane, the schoolteacher, was in love with Katrina Van Tassel who was very wealthy and pretty but she also had other admirers. One admirer was "Brom Bones" (Abraham Van Brunt). One day Ichabod received an invitation to a party at the VanTassel's, so he hired a horse and attended the affair. Upon leaving that evening, as he went thru the forest, Ichabod was remembering all the stories he had heard when he realized that he was being followed. The race began as he tried to get to the local church for safety but the other horseman was faster and threw something at Ichabod causing him to fall off his horse. The following day Ichabod's horse was found back home but no sign of him. Found in the forest was a smashed pumpkin along the trail. Ichabod Crane was never seen or heard from again. Katrina did marry Brom Bones....so maybe he was the Horseman and not the legendary one????


