#### JANUARY MEETING

Joe Coleman came back to complete the history of our neighboring village of Hulmeville.

In part one we heard about several fires and floods that destroyed many of the industries. Now we know how the resourceful people of Hulmeville rebuilt their town and even added businesses since then.

The first bank building still stands at 2 Water Street. In 1855 a school house was built on Main Street followed by a high school in 1890. The area was growing and finally a newspaper (The Beacon) appeared to be followed by the Delaware Valley Advance. The last surviving mill "OKO Plush Mill was still thriving in the 1980's.

Most of us know of Johnson Hall which was built in 1871 and the next year the town was incorporated in 1872.

Instead of just driving thru Hulmeville, take time to go down Main St. or the smaller streets to see what part of historic Hulmeville still survives.

Thank you Joe for sharing this local history with us and good luck with the sale of your book.

#### **FEBRUARY MEETING**

At the meeting on the 5<sup>th</sup> to hear Pat Mervine talk about the Boone Farm families, every seat was taken and about 6 people had to stand. This was the largest turnout we have ever had.

The Boone Farm will be the new location of the African American Museum and is located on Route #413 in Langhorne.

This building is situated on Lenni Lenape Indian land and was built in the early 1700's with additions added over several years.

Among the families that owned this property are the following names – Kirk, Dungan, Saddler, Preston, Martin, Beatty, Comfort, Parry, Gillingham, Osmond, Laughead, Jackson, and lastly Boone.

If you are interested in more history of this house, we have several copies of Pat's book available at the office. Titled "Boone Farm: Its People and Place in Middletown History" the cost is \$20 with all the money going to the African American Museum of Bucks Co. PA.

Many Thanks to Pat for sharing her knowledge of this building and its history.
